A "HISTORY" OF PHOTOGRAPHY AGNES B. COLLECTION

December 8, 2023 - April 7, 2024

agnès b. presents the seventh season of her collection at La Fab dedicated to the history of photography.

Over the years, agnès b. has built up a significant collection of contemporary art, first presented at the Abattoirs de Toulouse in 2004, though even before this it was the richness of her photographic holdings which became the subject of two exhibitions, in 2000 at the National Center for Photography in Paris and in 2002 at the Pavillon des Arts in Nogent-sur-Marne. In 2008, the prestigious C/O Berlin hosted an exhibition of her photographs, in parallel with the publication of a monograph of her collection by JP Ringier Editions.

The agnès b. collection, comprising more than 7,000 works, shows no particular preference for any medium; Agnès b. collects paintings, sculptures, installations, and videos, though with 2,500 documented prints it is evident that photography holds a significant place.

In 2000, agnès b. wrote:

"... If it is a collection, it resembles more of a free assembly than a deliberate construction. I could even say that the photos imposed themselves one by one, the first calling upon the next. Perhaps each photo, by its very own nature, demanded another one as beautiful, as moving, or as essential as itself. This is the common thread... I consider myself an amateur in both senses of the word, and it's a beautiful word. I claim eclecticism and refuse to prioritize one thing over another – each has its place. What matters is “the instantaneous”, the photographer, in a spiritual gesture chooses the moment in his life, in life, that which strikes him, that which he chooses to say...and with the same gesture, he can also create fictions, trick us for pleasure, recount untruths, serious or trivial – What freedom! And that's why I love photography."

In this exhibition, agnès b. takes the viewer on a chronological journey, starting with about a dozen chronophotographic silver gelatin negative plates, albumen prints, negative papers, sepia photographs, silver gelatin prints, dating from the second half of the 19th century demonstrating the photographer and collector's attachment to black and white prints up until the 80s before the explosion of color photography in the 90s. This chronological approach does not hinder the 'free assembly' that agnès b. fondly refers to as 'elective affinities'.

ANNEX **agnès b. and photography**

In 1984, **agnès b.** inaugurates the **Galerie du Jour**. It was on the advice of her friend Felix Guattari that she exhibited there, as the gallery's first photography exhibition, a personal collection of prints by **Martine Barrat**.

Subsequently, the **Galerie du Jour** showcased photographers such as **Martin Parr**, **Nan Goldin** and **Ryan McGinley** among others, with **agnès b.** being the first gallerist to represent their work in France.

And then there was agnès b's immediate commitment to the **Paris Photo fair**; the gallerist supported this Parisian event dedicated to photography from its very inception.

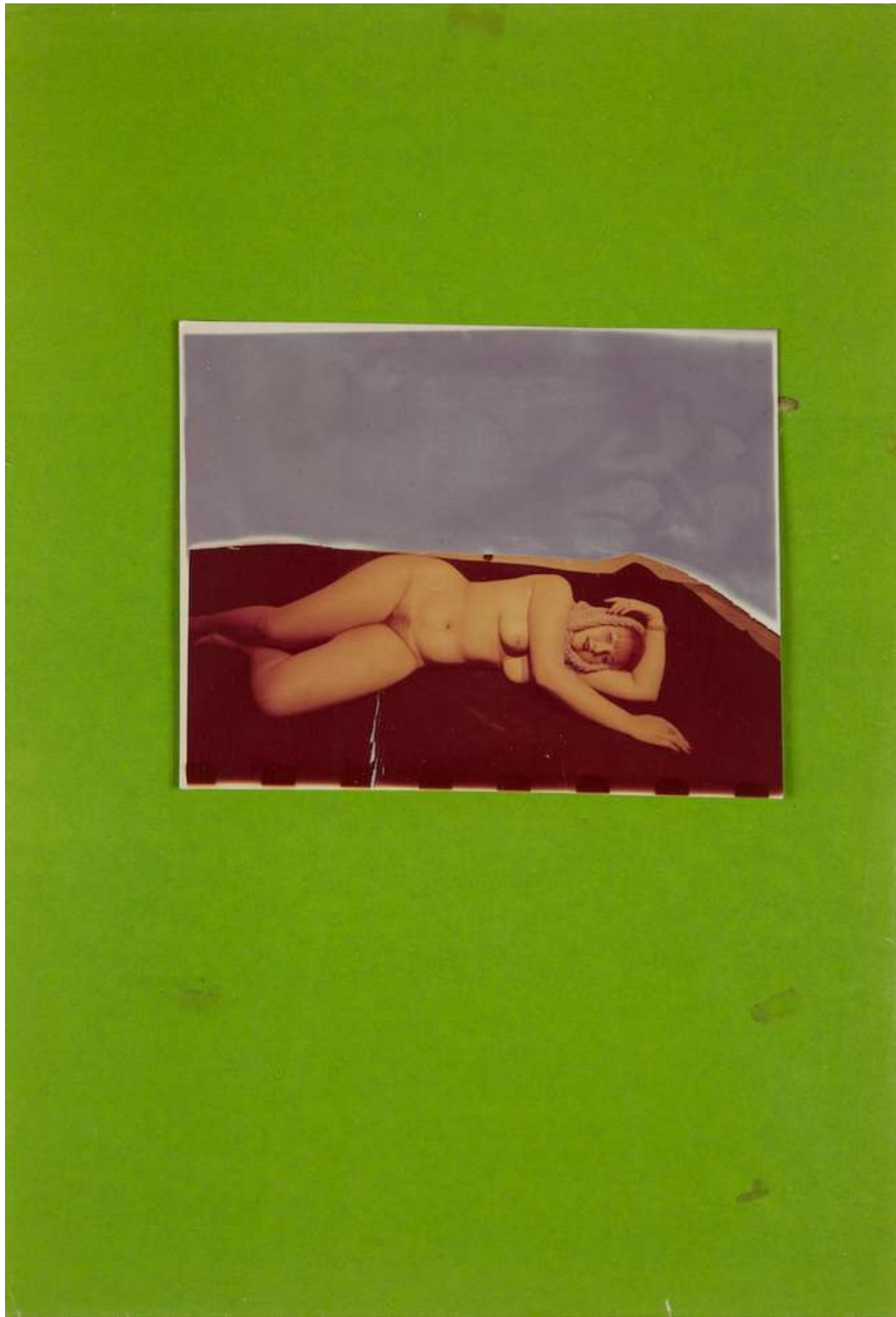

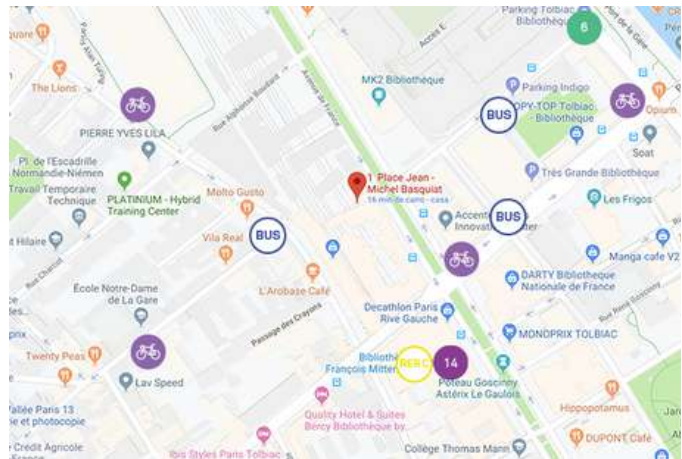

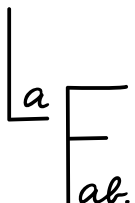
